

CITY COUNCIL
PALMYRA MO

December 17, 2009

The Palmyra City Council met on the above date at 7:00 p.m. in City Hall with Mayor Pro Tem Carolyn Andresen presiding. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. The following council members answered roll call: Gerre Feigenspan, Emmett Garner, Jim Bross, Tim Wright and Carolyn Andresen. Absent were Mayor Loren Graham and Councilman Gary Coleman. Also present was Ron Peer, Raymond Houston, Mark Cheffey, Gary Crane, Chase Hickman, Bill Romans and Kevin Smith from Allied Waste, Inc.

A motion was made by Councilman Garner and seconded by Councilman Feigenspan to approve the consent agenda as presented. The roll call vote was as follows: Ayes; Feigenspan, Garner, Bross, Wright and Andresen. Nays; none. The motion carried. The consent agenda included:

Allied Waste had presented a proposal to the city to supply a 95 gallon toter to each household to assist them in a more efficient and productive waste disposal and Mr. Romans and Mr. Smith were there to answer questions from the council. The placement of the toters will be a significant expense to Allied Waste so they are asking for an extension to the present contract. City Attorney Hickman will review the current contract and the city's bid policy before a decision is made. Mr. Romans and Mr. Smith left the meeting.

Gary Crane reported that the Street Department crew has almost completed the work on the fire station floor. He asked the status of the house number project. Following discussion it was agreed that the fire department will supply a list of offenders to the police, the police will make contact with the property owner and they will be given one week to comply with the ordinance before being issued a ticket.

Councilmember Reports: Councilman Garner inquired about a recent BPW meeting and the rate structure. Councilman Bross asked if the police department is ready to switch dispatching to Marion County 911. Officer Peer stated that the work to secure the building has not been done yet.

With no further business before the council a motion to adjourn was made at 7:50 p.m.
